JUNE 27, 2010

(Reflection offered by the Supreme Court Justice Hon. Francis X. Flaherty at the 10am Mass last weekend upon his selection as the recipient of the 2010 St. Thomas More Narragansett Medal)

The life of St. Thomas More should serve as an inspiration to all Catholic laymen, particularly lawyers, for whom he is the patron saint, for a host of reasons. More himself was a successful and brilliant lawyer, a political leader, an author, scholar, husband and father. St. Thomas More was known among his contemporaries to be particularly devout and humble.

The basic facts of his life, those that set him apart, are well known. By 1531, More had risen to the very pinnacle of power in England. He held the office of Lord Chancellor, had been knighted, and was Henry VIII most trusted advisor.

We all know that Thomas More lost everything – his wealth, his office, and his very life – because he refused to take an oath which said that Henry was supreme over even the Pope in matters of religion. For this he was deemed to be a traitor and sentenced to death. Although he did not want to die, he met his death calmly and with great courage. Indeed, the king did not want to execute Thomas, and he held him in the tower of London for a lengthy period of time, hoping he could negotiate a compromise with his trusted advisor. Thomas, however, would not compromise his faith or his principles. As he mounted the scaffold to be beheaded, his last words were “I die the king’s good servant, but God’s first.”

As inspiring as that life was, one must ask if the life of a saint who died nearly 500 years ago can have any relevance to the world that we live in today. But to me, St. Thomas More’s life, his principled stand, and his willingness to place his conscience over expediency and power have very real relevance in today’s world.

Too many of our modern political leaders and holders of powerful offices, many of them Catholics, are simply unwilling to live their lives and administer the duties of their offices in accordance with the principles, values, and beliefs that they claim to hold.

Too many fear the loss of office as a result of reprisals from one angry interest group or another and use that concern as a justification for turning their backs on what they say they believe.

To paraphrase a popular modern political expression, could we imagine Thomas More saying “Personally, I do not believe the king should be the supreme leader of the Church, but publically I support it and will take the oath”? After all, that’s all he had to say and his office, his wealth, his lands, and his life would have been saved.

But principles mean something, beliefs mean something, and values mean something, and Thomas stood by them whatever the cost.

And that is why he remains so very relevant in this day of flexible principles, where right very often is relegated to the back seat in favor of expediency.

Each of us, especially those of us in public life, whether we are Catholic or not, should study the life of St. Thomas More and should be influenced and inspired by his example of following his conscience and his heart, even when the consequences are severe.

In closing, may I thank you again for bestowing this wonderful honor on me. I will try to be worthy of it.
