Dear Parishioners,

The Lord be with you!

Every Catholic ~~knows~~ knew the response to this greeting of the priest at Mass. For the last forty years or so, the response was, “And also with you” which sounded like a personal greeting between the priest and the congregation. But after literally decades of work by thousands of people to translate the revised Roman Missal from Latin to English and months of catechesis and preparation for its implementation, this first weekend of Advent marks the beginning of the use of the new English translation. So the response to the priest when he says, “*The Lord be with you*” will now be, “*And with your spirit.*”

This response is more faithful to the original Latin, to the Scripture and highlights that when a man is ordained a priest, the Holy Spirit comes upon him in to enable him to act in the person of Christ in the celebration of the Mass and the sacraments. As we respond “And with your spirit” at four key moments of the Mass, we are invoking the Lord upon the spirit of the priest.

When Fr. T and I preached on the new translation at all the Masses a couple of weeks ago, we noted that the new wording will take some getting used to but it brings out many great truths of our faith. The new translation may even make us a little uncomfortable and that is OK. Sometimes we can get too comfortable with things and just go on autopilot. A little discomfort with the wording will be a wake-up call for all of us to reflect on the mysteries of our salvation which we celebrate in the Mass.

Advent is a season of preparation for worthily celebrating the Lord's Incarnation at Christmas and for the time when He will come again. Contemplating the mysteries of His love will lead us to a deeper appreciation of the greatest act of humility the world will ever know—when “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.” As we begin the season of Advent this new translation offers us a moment of grace to enter more deeply into the celebration of the Mass so that we may fully, actively, and consciously participate in the Mass each week.

Let's take advantage of these four weeks of Advent to prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord through prayer, reflection, and reception of the sacrament of reconciliation. By preparing ourselves well spiritually, we will truly have a joyous Christmas.
